Math is required for many jobs. And for those positions that require less math, extra math courses can often be the determining factor for who gets the job and later who gets the raise.

The data for the requirements on the Dropping Math chart was collected from various community college and university catalogs and the Occupational Outlook Handbook, 1996-97 Edition, published by the U. S. Department of Labor in January 1996. Your local colleges and employers may not require exactly the same amount of mathematics for each job listed. But remember, the more math your child takes, the more options there are, making your child a stronger candidate for a new job or promotion.
